{The "brothers" of the said William Grey who shared in this confirmation of arms were Henry and John, early settlers of Fairfield Conn, consequently their male descendants bearing the name are entitled to these arms."

Note: I have found that a William Gray of Hackney was of Kindred and of the. lineage of Sir Robert Gray, Esq. lately deceased Merchant Taylor of London. Robert had a nephew, Thomas Gray. If I can prove who Robert was we might find the father for William Gray, Harrow on the Hill.

#### SUPPLEMENT

Since this manuscript was concluded, further investigation revealed the fact that the family is entitled to use a coat of arms that was granted to William Gray merchant taylor of London and that he made request that the same right be granted to his brother John and Henry Gray who had emigrated to New England.

The New England Historical and Genealogical Magazine v. 61, p. 386 in the section devoted to Genealogical Research in England, communicated for the Committee on English Research, by Joseph Gardner Bartlett, Esq. submits this statement:

William Gray of Hackney being uncertain what arms his father was entitled to and showing that he was of the lineage and one of the heirs of Robert Gray, late of London merchant, deceased, to whom Sir Edward Bysshe, Garter, granted arms, the same arms duly differenced were confirmed to the said William Gray and his brothers; viz. Barry wavy of six, argent and azure, on a bend gules three garlands or. Nothing is said about the crest which we are acquainted with from another source. The quotation goes on to say that "The brothers" of the William Gray who shared in this confirmation of arms and crest were Henry and John Gray early settlers of Fairfield, Connecticut, consequently their male descendants bearing the name are entitled to bear these arms. (The original grant it will be seen gives all their posterity the right to bear these arms.)

From John Guillim's A Display of Heraldry, page 405, is this item on Robert Gray:

Granted to Robert Gray of London and Sheriff of London and Master of the Company of Merchant Taylors and to his nephew Thomas Gray by Richard St. George, Clarencieux.

Dated April 1635 in the reign of King Charles the First.

This grant of arms to Robert Gray is recorded in two documents in Harleian manuscripts 1470 which are preserved in the British Museum, ff. 10, 11.

For further confirmation of our right to bear arms this writer appealed to the highest authority on such matters the College of Arms in London, England E.C. 4 and had an extended correspondence with Captain Robin de la Lanne-Mirrlees, Rouge Dragon, of the Officers of Arms, pursuivant. He sent me the following copy of the grant of arms.

# **Bankside Farmers**

Daniel Frost 1613 - 1682

The Bankside Farmers were a group of five men who established themselves along the Long Island Sound south of Fairfield, Connecticut in 1648. They were: Thomas Newton, Henry Gray, John Green, Daniel Frost and Francis Andrews. The area is now known as Greens Farms, a section of Westport, Connecticut. The Grey and Frost families knew each other in England being from the same area near London, England. Greens Farms is named for John Green.

Daniel Frost was born January 17, 1613 in Nottingham, England and died February 23, 1682 in Fairfield. A small coastal promontory, Frost Point, is named for Daniel Frost.

Henry Gray was born November 23, 1617 in London, England. He worked as a tailor with his elder brother William in London for a time. He arrived in New England in 1639. He married Daniel Frost's sister Lydia in Boston, Massachusetts in September of 1639. He came to Fairfield in 1640 and was a deputy from Fairfield from 1642-43. He died in 1658. Two roads in the area are named for him: Gray's Farm Road and Gray Lane.

The name of the group comes from the area in England where they are originally from, Bankside, Nottingham England ..

These are the Wills of William Gray, Yeoman, and his son, William Gray, Citizen and Merchant Taylor of London.. [Copied from Genealogical Gleanings of England].

William Gray of Harrow on the Hill, Middlesex, yeoman, 27 January 1647, proved 4 January 1648. To my son John Grave twenty pounds. To son Henry twenty pounds. To son Isaac that cottage or tenement, now or lately in the occupation of Michell Anderson, lying and being in Hobgoblins Lane near Sudbury Green in the parish of Harrow on the Hill &c., being freehold &c. To my daughter in law Susanna Gray, the wife of my son William, five pounds as a token of love to her. To my grandchild Abraham Gray, son of William, forty shillings, and to Josiah forty shillings and to Rebecca, daughter of my son William, all my pewter, and to his youngest daughter, Priscilla, all my brass, as one pot one kettle &c. To my sister Rose Wight five pounds out of a greater sum she oweth me, which five pounds I give her as a token of my love unto her. To my cousins Thomas Ashwell and Mary his wife five pounds, to be distributed amongst their three children, as a token of my love. To Elizabeth Garde that three pounds that is in the hands of John Page of Aperton, yeoman. To William Peache son of John Peache of Greenford twenty shillings, to be deducted out of a greater sum his father John Peache oweth me. I make my son William Gray of London, merchant taylor, full and sole executor and give unto him all and singular my moneys, cattle, chattels, goods and lauds, and whatsoever is mine that is not yet heretofore disposed of &c. I further will that the five pounds I give my sister Rose Wight, after her decease shall be given to Thomas Ashwell's children.

NOTE:[The first two sons named in the foregoing will were doubtless the John and Henry Gray who were found in Fairfield, Connecticut, A.D. 1643 or thereabouts (see will of "William Gray, their brother and eldest son of the foregoing testator, ante., p. 264). Henry F. Waters.

William Grey, citizen and merchant tailor of London 1 September 1657; proved at London 18 November 1663. To sou Abraham the copyhold house and orchard in Hamerton, in parish of Hackney. To son Josia part of another copyhold house in Hamerton with two barns, stable and cowhouse &c. To daughter Rebecca Grey another part. To youngest daughter Susanna Grey another part. Other lands in Hackney to these four children. To son Abraham the fee farm rent of the watermills at Barking, Essex, of fifteen pounds per annum or thereabouts. To son Josiah all other rents or tenths payable to me in the manors or parishes of Barking, East Ham or West Ham in said county of Essex, which amount in the whole about nine pounds three shillings and two pence. To daughter Rebecca (other rents) and all that Last of red herrings due unto me yearly from the bayliffs of Great Yarmouth in the County of Norfolk. To daughter Susanna (other rents). If wife be with child then such child to have an equal portion with the other four children.

Item i give and bequeath unto my loving brother .John Grey of New England the sum of five pounds of lawful **money** of England as an expression of my love to him. To brother Henry Grey the like sum of five pounds &c. And these two five pounds not to be paid until two years after my decease. To brother Isaac Grey my buff coat and five pounds to buy a piece of plate. To wife Susanna leases at Hamerton and lease of tenement in Birchin Lane. London, known by the sign of the Cross Keys. To brother in law M''' John Price twenty shillings to buy him a ring. And the like sum to cousin John Smith, potter. To the poor of the church at Stepney of which M'Will'''Greeuhill is pastor the full jjrofit of that Last of red herrings &c. for one year only next after my decease and no longer. And that year's i^rofit I appoint to be paid unto the assissors and deacons of the said church whereof one M'''' Robert Williams my dear brother in Christ is one. Wife Susanna to be executrix and guardian to all the children and brother in law John Price and brother Isaac Grey to be overseers. Juxon, 130.

Note: [Savage has several John Grays who were in New England. — Editor.]

The wills of William Gray d. 1647/48 and William Gray d. 1663 tie the family together along with the information in the book, "Families of Old Fairfield, Connecticut". Henry and John Gray immigrants to New England are the sons of William Gray d. 1647 and the brothers of William Gray of Hackney. I believe the parents are William Grey and Mary Button who married Apr. 1587 in Harrow on the Hill, London, England...

## Searching for the father of our William Gray.

After doing quite a bit of research, I thought Thomas Greye, Grocer of London, b. 1528 son of Alexander Grey, d. 1556 St. Savior, Southwarke, England. might be the father of William Gray, until I read the will of Thomas Greye, d. 1590. his son, William is not listed. Other researchers have identified him as such, but after reading Thomas's will I do not think so. I fail to see how a dead person can have children. The register of St Dionis Backchurch parish shows a William Grey born and died shortly after also lists a death for the William Grey son of Thomas Greye. I have also found in the document 1533-1930 Grey Pedigree a reference depicting him to be the head of our family. My

aim is to find a will for a William Gray that died 1638, St Mary, Harrow London, England that I am having difficulty finding.

Other researchers have indicated that William Grey, son of Edward Grey and Catherine Le Strange was the father of our William. But if you read the information on this Edward Grey, it states that the son, William, died the same year he was born, 1585. .

Ezra and his siblings were born in Connecticut and eventually moved to New York. Ezra's brother, Francis Asbury Gray lived at Great Bend, Susquehanna Co, Pennsylvania until he moved to Wisconsin after the 1850 census and 1852 when he built a sawmill. All of his children were born in Pa. Daniel was quite close to Francis's son Chester and lived near him after moving to Wisconsin.

Lived Pennsylvania moved to New Jersey where Sidney was from around 1895, she is found in New Jersey since she was from there, I believe she inherited from her parents property in New Jersey.

Note: Two children of Ezra Gray, 1 male 1 female, names unknown, left home as the 1845 census shows two more children than what is listed in 1850 census. Information on Ezra Gray obtained from Broome County Town Historian, New York in the 1980's. They lived in Sanford, New York then later Windsor, Broome Co., New York.

Ezra Gray and Cynthia Whipple married in Deposit, New York about 1829. They had a son and daughter that left home before 1850 census, so only know of those that were born after them. They lived at Windsor, New York until after the 1860 census, after that Cynthia is found in Pennsylvania until her death in 1890-1900.

George Gray, a carpenter, is found in 5 Aug 1870 census with his mother, Cynthia Gray, and a wife, Sidney b. New Jersey, and child, Raymond, less than one year old in Bridgewater, Susquehanna Co., PA.

Then I found George Gray in the 1880 census taken 10 June 1880 in Montrose Bough, Susquehanna Co., PA. Cynthia Gray, age 70, Betsey T. age 34, Jane {Emily| Powley {widow} age 40, both daughters of Cynthia Gray. George and wife, Sidney, died New Jersey 1910 and 1918.

I found a death certificate for Emily Jane Powley dated 13 Feb. 1908, Montrose, Susquehanna Co., PA according to census of 1880 she is the daughter of Cynthia Gray. Sister Betsey was the informant (Bessie M. Gray)

Daniel Gray's military records stated that his next of kin, his father, Ezra Gray, was living in Great Bend, Susquehanna Co., PA in 1864/65. He divorced Emma in 1865 according to military records.

Hiram Gray's military records say his father as Ezra Gray of Great Bend, Susquehanna Co., Pennsylvania. His wife Caroline Lane applied for pension at Montrose, Susquehanna. Penn. In 1878.

Daniel's pension records show a divorce in 1865 from an Emma, no other info available. Daniel was soldier in the Civil War. His next of kin listed as Ezra Gray, Great Bend Susquehanna Co. PA in 1864. He fought for the North during the Civil War from Dec. 1863 to July 1865. Enlisted from Almond, Wis. He was wounded at the battle of Nashville and hospitalized there and again at Louisville, Ky. After the war he suffered from rheumatism and piles and in 1886 he filed for an Invalid Pension and later after his death his wife filed for a widow's pension. He was a carpenter and died from a fall from a roof. Eliza Ostrander's family fought for the South.

Daniel wrote a diary that I got a copy of from Virgie McCumber who lived in Seattle in the 1980's. Virgie was related through the Battreall's family line, I think. Daniel traveled through Iowa, Wisconsin and neighboring area to get and work odd jobs as a carpenter. While in his travels he visited and talked of an Aunt Sallie Sheldon who lived near Iowa in Wisconsin. I don't know the relationship of Sallie and Daniel, but it appears from the diary they were close. I think she is the person who cared for Grandpa as a child between 1861 [Eliza's death and 1869 when he remarried. Eliza Ostrander Gray died in Oct 1861.

I have done quite a bit research on the Thomas Gray b. 1767 Fairfield, CT family. Ezra and Francis Asbury Gray especially. After the Great Bend, Susquehanna Co., PA 1850 census, we find Francis and family in Wisconsin. Then after the 1855 census, we

find Daniel Gray, the entire John Ostrander family, and Jedidiah Alexander family in Wisconsin. Recently I was searching Wisconsin cemeteries and found in one cemetery in Plainfield, Wisconsin some members of that family where four members died all in the same month of Oct 1856. William Ostrander and his father, John Ostrander, a child of Betsey and Calvin Springsteen, and grandfather, Jedidiah Alexander.

I'd been looking for a long time for the place and date of death of or Eliza Jane Ostrander who died near Plainfield, Wisconsin. She was the daughter of John Ostrander and wife of Daniel W. Gray. I found her buried in same cemetery, Oct 1861.

Lucy Stoddard, the wife of Francis Asbury Gray died in 1870 in Wisconsin. In Mar. 1872, he traveled to Windsor, Broome Co., NY and married Katherine Summerton of Great Bend, Susquehanna Co., PA.

The name Ostrander was originally Pietersee and changed when the family came through Ellis Island.

Note: Not sure where or when Daniel and Eliza married, probably 1857-58 in Wisconsin. They moved to Wisconsin late 1855 or early 1856 after the New York State census of 1855. .

I was told that the Grey family spelling changed as a result of a disagreement between William Delvin Grey, Grandpa and his bro., Frank.


